Categories:

Eligible projects can be submitted to any of the AIA Baltimore Excellence and Design Awards categories with the exception of unbuilt projects. The award will be given at the jury's discretion.

Selection Guidelines:

A local 3-member jury from the architecture and business communities will evaluate:

- How design contributed to the project's success
- The level of architect and client collaboration
- Measurable results versus stated goals
- The quality of the architectural design solution

The jury will also consider innovation, benefit to user and client, appropriate aesthetics and visual appeal, and the bottom line result.
